Our Services

Lincoln Literacy is a private, nonprofit agency that provides free workforce readiness English classes to refugees. Our volunteer teachers help refugees to understand, speak, read, and write English.



You can learn in a group, or you can learn one-on-one with a tutor. Our teachers will help you use English to:

- Search for a job.
- Complete job applications.
- Interview for jobs.
- Understand American job practices.

Getting Started

To become a student with us is easy.

First: You can come to our office on any Monday afternoon between 2:00 and 4:00 p.m. or to Bennett Martin Library on any Saturday afternoon between 1:00 and 3:00 p.m. Please note that we do not provide this service during holidays. See the maps on next page for directions. If those days and times are not good for you, call Lincoln Literacy for an appointment. Be sure to let us know that you are a refugee. The number to call is: 402-476-7323.


Second: Our staff will ask you for some information about your refugee status, your goals, your family and your current address. Then they will test your English ability. Don't worry about the test. We help students at all levels, from beginning to advanced.

Third: Our staff will tell you about English classes you can take. Lincoln Literacy offers classes at many times and locations. *Some of our group classes offer free child-minding and transportation services.*

Fourth: You will start classes. As a refugee, you will receive books and instruction for free. Classes run from September — December, and from January — May, with a summer session in June and July. You can start anytime. It is important to attend regularly and continue classes even if you get a job, so that you can master English.

Finding Us

Lincoln Literacy is located downtown at 9th & G Streets. Open enrollment on Mondays from 2:00 — 4:00 p.m.



Lincoln Literacy also offers enrollment on Saturdays from 1:00 — 3:00 p.m. at Bennett Martin Library, located at 14th & N Streets.
